About Rotary International

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, was formed in 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to capture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The Rotary name derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread, and within a decade, clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York to Winnipeg, Canada. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents. The organization adopted the Rotary International name a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving club members' professional and social interests. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its motto: **Service Above Self**.

Of the things we think, say or do:


- 1) Is it the **TRUTH**?


- PolioPlus: For more than 25 years, Rotary has been a leader in the global effort to eradicate polio.
- Rotary Peace Centers: Rotary Peace Fellows are leaders promoting national and international cooperation, peace, and the successful resolution of conflict throughout their lives, in their careers, and through service activities.
- Rotary Grants: District grants fund smaller, short-term activities that address needs in both our local community and communities worldwide. Each district gets to choose which projects it will fund with these grants.
- Group Study Exchange: Teams of professionals between the ages of 25 and 40 travel internationally 4-6 weeks during these cultural and vocational exchanges.
